

<u>School Levels</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Pre-Kindergarten	36 to 60 months of age
Elementary School	Grades not exceeding 8th grade
Middle School	Grades including 6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th grades.
High School	Grades exceeding the 8th grade.
Adult High School	A program operated by a school district with the approval of the DOE. The Adult Program serves students 16 or 17 years of age for HSE(formerly GED) preparation only, or students 18 years of age or older for Adult Standard Diploma, Proficiency Preparation, HSE Preparation or ELL basic literacy.
Other Combination	A school with a combination of grade levels K-12 which do not fall under any of the other school levels.
Program Only	A fictitious school created in order to track a specific population of students who are not enrolled in an actual school but need a State Unique ID number assigned to them.

<u>School Type</u>	<u>Definition</u>
Regular	School which does not fall under any of the other specific Types.
Adult	A program operated by a school district with the approval of the DOE. The Adult Program serves students 16 or 17 years of age for HSE(formerly GED) preparation only, or students 18 years of age or older for Adult Standard Diploma, Proficiency Preparation, HSE Preparation or ELL basic literacy.
Alternative	A program for the education of pupils at risk of dropping out of school, including pupils who are enrolled in kindergarten or grades 1 to 12 inclusive” (NRS 388.537) Juvenile Detention Facilities are included in this category. Students are eligible for DSA funding.
BIE/BIA	Bureau of Indian Education/Bureau of Indian Affairs
Charter	Independent Schools outside of the local school districts
Charter Virtual School	A public school that offers only instruction in which students and teachers are separated by time and/or location, and interaction occurs via computers and/or telecommunications technologies.
Correctional	Correctional Programs are operated by school districts within a correctional facility (ie. Prisons or Conservation Camps). Students who are adjudicated adults and may only participate in an adult education program and are not eligible for DSA funding.
Home School	A Home School is a school in which parents teach their children at home. These students fall under the School Level PG (Program Only). Students may be enrolled in order to take State Assessments.
Migrant School	A fictitious school created to track students’ families who have moved to obtain agricultural work. These students fall under the School Level PG (Program Only).
Private School	A school supported by a private organization or individuals rather than by the government.
Special Education	A school specially designed for the instruction of special needs students.
University	A public school for profoundly gifted pupils.
